Dear Geniva,

So proud to hear from you & thanks for your information. Guess you think I didn't appreciate your help. But Seem's like writing is a problem for me. as we have three children to write doesn't seem like I ever get my writing caught-up.

So sorry you were in hosp. but happy for you lie home again.

My husband went to Murphysboro hosp. Feb. 12<sup>th</sup> had gland surgery. we've went to Murphysboro for you. too had if we were there at same time & not know it.

Jess + Clara came in day or so after you all went to Grady's Gen's. oh, wish you had come by. all of uncle Albert's children know where we live they could brought you all over. Clara + Jess called Sunday & said they didn't believe Grady would live too long.

I had gotten a letter from uncle Denton's daughter (Nell) just before I got yours maybe a wk before + she gave uncle Denton date. I knew he died close to Thanksgiving of 67 for our bro. died Sept 14-1967 & then uncle Denton. Nell told me her mother (Aunt Sirtie) was 68 last Sat. I called her to say happy birthday she was so pleased for me being so thoughtful.

Geniva, as you will see grandpa Orrick's other sis Name (Mary) she hurt her back don't know how.

Great Aunt Virginia Elizabeth has a granddaughters  
 lives in Manchester (Lizzie O'Kelley) her mother was  
 Aunt V. E. Oldest Child. She was 91 Couple yrs ago.  
 She is almost blind, never been to see her + I call to  
 check on her she has a daughter never married that lives  
 with her. Oh! yes Cousin Lizzie mother's name (Hess).  
 I'm sending you their Bible record. Cousin Colonel is  
 Aunt V. E. 9<sup>th</sup> Child + lives at Merrison. He + wife (Gren)  
 are very smart. Cousin Colonel gave me his mother's Bible +  
 her photo album, he didn't know who had taken the picture  
 out. Anyway I was so proud of Aunt Virginia Elizabeth's  
 Bible + album. He said his mother took enough other  
 Bibles + sold to get this Bible.

To grandpa Orick's dad. Aunt Jessie's daughter Hazel  
 said Uncle Isham told Aunt Jessie that John Rains  
 was his dad. Also Cousin Colonel Wood told us John Rains  
 was grandpa's dad

John Rains born May 5 - 1828 - died June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1857  
 his wife Mary born 1832 died 1892

They had 3 children Rebecca + John W. died very  
 young + was buried at Cherry Cemetery in Cannon Co.  
 They have a steel fence around their graves +  
 very expensive rock for that time very tall rocks.

Their other son Doc lived to be up in years. Doc had 3  
 sons + one his son's (Elija born 1876) married Aunt  
 Virginia E. daughter (Anna) also buried at Cherry Cemetery  
 S. L. talked to John Rains great grand son by marriage  
 he told S. L. John Rains was a wealthy man He not only  
 had money he also had gold. - his great grand son said  
 they never did know what John did with ~~it~~ part of it  
 I see believe he gave it to great grandma Nancy (Aunt)  
 with Education grandpa + Aunt Virginia E. had me

feel he helped her. Some of <sup>the</sup> family <sup>part</sup> Aunt Virg. Eliz.  
could do the most beautiful needle work they ever saw  
& we know Grandma Nancy Surly taught her.  
Cousin Colonel told us his mother (Aunt Virg. Eliz.) was the  
power behind the throne. That she taught his dad. his  
A. B. C.'s & John Wood, Aunt V. E. husband was justice of  
Peace in Warren Co. for yrs. and 6 of Aunt V. E. & John  
Children made School teachers! Cousin Colonel was a teacher  
as you can. Chick John Rains was 29 when he died & our  
Granddad was 14 days old we've ask different one can't find  
out what caused his death, we've also wondered if he knew  
Grandpa was born (or) saw him. Uncle Isham said they  
grew up together. & from some reason John Rains moved to  
Cannon County & his wife Mary was a Cannon Co. girl.  
I never the reason that Grandma Nancy is typed as  
widow & I haven't told our children, after all if every couple  
that does the same thing, had children like Grandma Nancy  
& John Rains they wouldn't be standing room in this  
wicked world. such a great no. of School girls quit School  
to have a baby or abortion. every yr. all I know Patsy was  
Grandma Nancy's mother & her husband died young. there  
was the Orrick Cemetery we went & talked to the people that  
~~live~~ or bought part of Orrick place that had the Cemetery. this  
man said his father-in-law ask Grandpa Orrick to come  
show him how much to fence in for the Cemetery Grandpa  
told him he would. but Grandpa got sick & died & <sup>thought</sup> over to  
fence it in. Now when this man that talked to Grandpa died.  
then Mr Brewer that married his daughter bought it. we went  
over & ask them about the Cemetery, we couldn't wait to get  
there for we knew we could get Patsy's dates her husband & get  
lot of information, oh! me he <sup>said</sup> yes there was a Cemetery & I took  
my slide & old mule put the rocks on the slide & put them in a  
well. & worked over the graves, he said there were 2 or 3 rocks he  
had a hard time getting it on his slide so large. we ask if  
they had names & dates on them he said yes but I don't  
on page 1 remember

for they didnt mean a thing to me, and the big building.  
He tore it down + used it for wood. way he described the  
building it was a church house + a well. the Orricks  
had a double log house, 2 story, hall between + fireplace  
at each end. + the best orchard + they were workers.  
He told what his father-in-law told him. + Mr Rigsby  
told us that this man that destroyed the cemetery. before he  
destroyed it. He came to ~~Mr~~ Mr Rigsby wanted him to help do  
some work on his back porch. He went. + this old man went  
to the cemetery + got a rock + put under his porch. I ask  
Mr Rigsby if they were writing on the rock. he said yes.  
but he didnt pay any attention.  
that old man was so wicked if only he hadnt destroyed  
those rocks, what wonderful help we could get.

With John Rains 29 when he died. grandma Nancy was very  
young + not having more children surely John Rains was  
only man she ever cared for. oh! we can wander about  
so many things, no way for us to know.

Cousin Colonel Wood wife. Cousin Irene told me that people told  
her that Colonel's mother was so beautiful surely she look like  
the mother of Jesus. + that Colonel's mother had an awfully hard time.

I've written in a rush hope you can make every thing  
out.

I must say hi to your husband + close for now  
I'm sending you some pictures, wish you would send  
back.
